SUNDANCE MOUNTAIN SOUTH ASSOCIATION Membership Meeting November 15, 1997

The annual membership meeting of the Sundance Mountain South Association was held Saturday, November 15, 1997 at the New Market municipal Building. The meeting, with 29 members present, was called to order at 1:05 PM by the president, David Whitney.

The minutes of the previous meeting held Saturday, November 9, 1996 were accepted unanimously.

The treasurer, Jeff Earman, gave his report and it was accepted for filing.

Bob Reichard gave the road report outlining the proposed capital projects and regular maintenance work for 1998. Several positive comments on the condition of the roads in the development were forthcoming from the membership.

Reichard reported on the water systems noting that repairs had decreased generally. A suggestion was made to consider producing a comprehensive map of the locations of water lines and valves for future reference.

The question was raised concerning the availability of 911 addresses and street names for the Rockingham County section of the development. Shep Wright responded that names were already assigned and it was just a matter of the county getting around to putting up the signs.

The proposed budget for 1998 was presented to the membership by the president, David Whitney. He announced that the assessment for the coming year would be \$250.00 for roads and \$40.00 for well electric. A motion to accept the 1998 budget and annual assessments was made by Bob Leidenheimer, seconded by Steve Meyer, and approved unanimously by the attending members.

A brief discussion of the "hunter situation" in the development was followed by the suggestion to investigate the possibility of securing some kind of vehicle stickers or hanging tags to easily identify property owners and guests.

The following change to the Bylaws of the Association was presented by the president:

No director may receive compensation for exercising the duties and obligations of a director or officer, except that a director serving as treasurer may receive a waiver from the board of directors of any regular or special assessment prorated on an annual basis as long as they are treasurer.

The motion to accept the change was made by Shep Wright, seconded by Bill Millward, and approved unanimously.

Whitney presented the following directors for re-election to a

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three-year term: Diane Gannon, Darlene Guinn, Shepherd Wright. No additional nominations were received from the floor resulting in these three directors being elected unanimously.

Whitney responded to a question concerning the updating of the directories by saying that the policy would be to print new ones every two years.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned 3:10 PM.

Proposed change to Sundance Association bylaws 11-15-97

The board of directors proposes to add the following language, underlined, to Section 6 (f) of the association bylaws regarding compensation for members of the board:

No director may receive compensation for exercising the duties and obligations of a director or officer, except that a director serving as treasurer may receive a waiver from the board of directors of any regular or special assessment, provided on a reconting Basis as come as the Director Hours that position.

EXPLANATION: The most tedious and time-consuming job on the board of directors is that of the treasurer. The position requires constant attention and vigilance. The treasurer is responsible for keeping track of member accounts -- who has paid, how much and when. The treasurer is responsible for regularly checking the association's post office box in New Market, forwarding correspondence to the proper board official and processing and paying in a timely manner all bills for services provided to the association. In addition, the treasurer is responsible for billing out special assessments for repair of water lines and well systems, maintaining accurate records on payments and making sure members whose accounts are delinquent are contacted.

This has been the most difficult position on the board to keep filled. We've had two terrific treasurers, Debbie Diehl and Jeff Earman. The time requirements of the job and the rather unforgiving nature of the duties, however, make this a high-turnover position.

The proposal before the association is an experiment to see if a kind of collective community "thank you" through a waiver of association road assessments will help reduce turnover in a job that needs a steady hand. The board's concern is that without some sort of incentive to help improve longevity of service, the association will have to contract out collection and bookkeeping services at great expense.

It is the board's intention that the waiver will apply only to annual assessments for road maintenance, and will not affect annual well-electric fees or special assessments for well repair work.

- 3) 1997 receipts from annual road and well assessments totaled \$19,550, assuming all members fully pay by 12-31-97. Proposed 1998 receipts will total \$19,000, reflecting a proposed drop from \$50 to \$40 in well-electric assessments.
