KEY TOPICS - SHENANDOAH COUNTY ORDINANCES

DOGS

It shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog to permit or allow such dog to run or be at large
within the County. For the purposes of this section, a dog shall be deemed to be "at large" while
roaming, running or self-hunting off the property of its owner or custodian and not under its
owner's or custodian's immediate control.

OPEN BURNING

• When open burning of debris waste is to occur within Shenandoah County, the person responsible for the burning shall obtain a permit from the Fire Marshal prior to the burning. Such a permit may be granted only after confirmation by the Fire Marshal that the burning can and will comply with the provisions of this chapter and any other conditions which are deemed necessary to ensure that the burning will not endanger the public health and welfare or to ensure compliance with any applicable provisions of the State Air Pollution Control Board's Regulations for the Control and Abatement of Air Pollution. The permit may be issued for each occasion of burning or for a specific period of time deemed appropriate by the Fire Marshal.

DOOR TO DOOR SOLICITATION

 All persons, before entering into or upon residential premises within the county for the purpose of soliciting, shall register with the County Sheriff and receive a permit.

VEHICLES

- Any motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer or part thereof that is not in operating condition; or which
 is stored on property zoned for residential, commercial or agricultural purposes not kept within a
 fully enclosed building; or which for a period of sixty (60) days or longer has been partially or
 totally disassembled by the removal of tires and wheels, the engine or other essential parts
 which are necessary for the operation of such vehicle and which is not contained within a fully
 enclosed building or on which there is displayed neither valid license plate nor valid inspection
 decal.
- The County may take into custody any abandoned motor vehicle. In such connection, the County may employ its own personnel, equipment and facilities or hire persons, equipment and facilities or firms or corporations who may be independent contractors for the purpose of removing, preserving and storing abandoned motor vehicles. The person at whose request such motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer or part thereof is so removed shall indemnify the County against any loss or expense incurred by reason of removal, storage or sale thereof.
